

Burlingame, Calif. (Nov. 28, 2025) — **Music at Kohl Mansion**, the Bay Area's venerable presenter of international chamber music programs, will celebrate the holidays with a whimsical Baroque Holiday Program featuring **Musica Pacifica** and guest artist, Korean soprano **Chea Kang** on Sunday, Dec. 14. The performance will begin at 7 p.m. at Burlingame's cherished landmark, Kohl Mansion, 2750 Adeline Drive.

Since its founding in 1990, Musica Pacifica has become widely recognized as one of America's premier baroque ensembles, lauded for both the dazzling virtuosity and the warm expressiveness of its performances. They have been described by the press as "some of the finest baroque musicians in America" (American Record

Guide) and "among the best in the world" (*Alte Musik Aktuell*). In the Bay Area, the artists perform with Philharmonia Baroque, American Bach Soloists, Berkeley Early Music Festival, and appear with many other prominent early music ensembles nationally and abroad. Recent performances include Music Before 1800 and the Frick Collection; the Getty Museum; the Cleveland Art Museum; the Pittsburgh Renaissance and Baroque Society; the Seattle Early Music Guild; the Houston Early Music Society; and the LA County Museum.

Korean soprano **Chea Kang*** is recognized for her distinctive voice and innovative artistry, consistently bringing creativity and originality to her performances. She has appeared at San Francisco Opera, where she debuted as Sister Catherine in *Dialogues of the Carmelites* (2022), covered Papagena in *The Magic Flute* (2024), and joined the Merola Opera Program as a young artist in the summer of 2025. She is the second prize winner of the 2024 Handel Aria Competition and a semifinalist in the 2024 Concert Artists Guild Competition. A graduate of The Juilliard School and San Francisco Conservatory of Music, Kang will perform the role of Belle in Philip Glass's *La Belle et la Bête* with Opera Parallèle in March 2026, following her company debut earlier this year as Henrietta Wong in *Harvey Milk Reimagined*.

MORE CHAMBER MUSIC IN 2026

Music at Kohl Mansion concerts will continue in 2026 with the local debut of the **Balourdet Quartet***, Jan. 18; the elegant **Lysander Piano Trio**, Feb. 22; the amazing woodwind quintet **Windsync***, March 22; the house debut of the **Beo String Quartet***, April 19; and the return of the renowned **Calidore String Quartet**, May 3. All concert performances are Sunday evenings at 7 p.m. Ample free parking is available.
